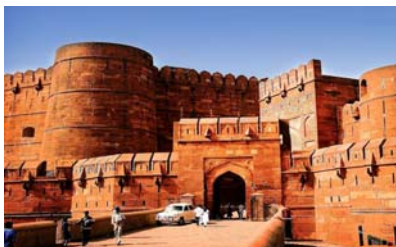
COMPREHENSIVE SIGHTS & ACTIVITIES

NEW DELHI

- **India Gate** - Built from sandstone, this arch also houses the Eternal Flame, a gesture in memory of the Indian soldiers who laid their lives in the 1971 war with Pakistan.
- **Raj Ghat** - The last resting place of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi.
- **The Jama Masjid (Mosque)** – This is the largest, finest and is among the famous mosques of India, built by Shah Jahan, the Mughal Emperor in the year 1648.
- **Qutab Minar** - The soaring tower of the brick tiled magic has become an important landmark of Delhi.

AGRA

- **Taj Mahal*** – A Treasure of the World & a Memorial to Love. Built by Mughal Emperor Shahjahan in 1630 in memory of his beloved Queen Mumtaz Mahal.
- **Agra Fort (Known as Red Fort)** – Built by Akbar in Red Sandstone when he was through with the consolidation of his power after accession to power in 1654, Agra Fort worked both as a military strategic point as well as the royal residence.
- **Fatehpur Sikri** A World Heritage site. The Panch Mahal, or Palace of Five Storeys, and the Buland Darwaza, a massive gate which provides entrance to the complex, remain unsurpassed in their beauty and elegance Fatehpur includes the Jama Masjid (Imperial Mosque), Salim Chisti tomb, Diwani-Aam, and Jodh Bai's Palace. The entire city is a harmonious blend of Muslim and Hindu motifs.



JAIPUR

- **Amber Fort** – Amber Fort overlooks the Moata Lake and is rated as a marvel of bastion excelling in architectural and building skills. Amber had the distinction of being the capital for six long centuries before Jaipur came into being. A fascinating blend of Hindu and Muslim influences is distinctly discernible in its architecture.
- **Hawa Mahal** - Hawa Mahal, literally means "The Palace of Winds" was built in 1799, is a remarkable landmark of Jaipur. So named because the palace has specially latticed screens and arches for an unbridled flow of the air currents but is a set pattern with the passage of the sun.
- **Jantar Mantar** – An Observatory with huge instruments in intricate masonry offers an accurate measurement of the time, the declination of the sun, the altitude and the azimuth, the position of constellations in the sky for the day, the eclipses and the allied astronomical phenomena.
- **City Palace** – This is a former royal residence with imposing blend of traditional Rajasthani and Mughal architecture and the craftsmanship.

- Dinner at local Muslim Restaurant before check into hotel.

Day 04 Jaipur (B/L/D)

- After breakfast, full day city tour of Jaipur includes photo-stop at Hawa Mahal, Amber Fort, City Palace and Jantar-Mantar Observatory.
- Lunch at local Muslim restaurant.
- Dinner at local Muslim restaurant.

Day 05 Jaipur /Delhi - Departure (B/L/D)

- After breakfast, visit local market.
- Lunch at local Muslim restaurant before drive to Delhi.
- Upon arrival in Delhi, dinner with Cultural Dance Show at a local Muslim Restaurant before transfer to airport for departure.
